4. Approval of Academic Regulations of M.Tech (R25), as per JNTUK

The Chairman presented the proposed Academic Regulations for the PG-M.Tech (R25) program. Salient points of the regulations are:

Total Credits: 80

Detention:

- Shortage of attendance below 65 % in any course shall in no case be condoned
- Required attendance ($\geq 65\%$) in at least four courses in first semester for promotion to second semester and at least four courses in second semester for promotion to third semester

Re-registration:

- A student whose shortage of attendance is not condoned in any course(s) in any semester, he/she has to seek re-registration for those course(s) in subsequent semesters as and when offered.
- Re-registration allowed for maximum of THREE ~~four~~ courses in a semester provided the internal marks secured by a candidate are less than 50% and has failed in the end examination.

CIE Evaluation:

- The continuous / internal evaluation shall be made based on the average of the marks secured in the two Mid Term-Examinations.
- Each midterm examination shall be conducted for a total duration of 120 minutes with 4 questions (without choice) each question for 10 marks

Decision: The members of the Academic Council thoroughly reviewed and approved the R25 regulations of PG-M.Tech program.

5. Approval of UG & PG (I Semester) Academic Calendars for the A.Y 2025-26.

The academic calendars of UG and PG programs first year for the academic year 2025-26 are presented.
